SUMMER STORM SAFETY

Lightning can strike from 10 miles away. If you hear thunder, lightning is close enough to pose a threat.

Inside is best. Stay away from windows, doors, & things that conduct electricity such as corded phones, wiring, plumbing, & anything connected to the house.



If caught outside with no safe shelter nearby:

- Never shelter under an isolated tree, tower or utility pole. Lightning tends to strike the taller objects in an area.
- Immediately get off of elevated areas such as hills, mountain ridges, or peaks.
- Immediately get out of and away from ponds, lakes, & other bodies of water.
- . Never lay flat on the ground.

The best way to protect yourself against lightning injury or death is to monitor the weather & postpone or cancel outdoor activities when thunderstorms are in the forecast.

Any time you plan new construction and/or landscaping projects which require you to dig on your property, you must contact one of the following organizations two full days before you begin. Once they notify us, our employees will visit your worksite and mark the buried facili-
